CHAPTER 3 USE AND OCCUPANCY CLASSIFICATION

307.9 Amendments. The following changes shall be made to the IFC for the use of Exception 13 in Section 307.1:

5506.5.1.1 5606.5.1.1 Smokeless propellant. No more than 100 pounds (45 kg) of smokeless propellants in containers of eight pounds (3.6 kg) or less capacity shall be displayed in Group M occupancies.

- 9. Change Section 5506.5.2.1 5606.5.2.1 of the IFC as follows:

5506.5.2.1 5606.5.2.1 Smokeless propellant. Commercial stocks of smokeless propellant shall be stored as follows:

- 1. through 3. (no change)
- 4. Smokeless propellants not stored according to Item 1, 2 or 3 above shall be stored in a Type 2 or 4 magazine in accordance with Section 3304 5604 and NFPA 495.
