1. Receive directions about sample collection and a sample kit at the Sussex Extension office (233 L. South County Drive, Waverly, Virginia 23890) September 25, 2018 2:00 PM.
2. Collect samples on September 26, 2018 and drop off samples 8:00 AM - 10:00 AM Sussex County Extension office.
3. Samples are analyzed at Virginia Tech.
4. Receive your confidential results October 24th, 2018 at 2:00 PM, an explanation of what they mean, and information about addressing any problems or concerns at Sussex County Extension office.

Testing includes: Iron, Manganese, Sulfate, Hardness, Sodium, Copper, Nitrate, Arsenic, Fluoride, pH, Total Dissolved Solids, Coliform bacteria, E. coli bacteria, Lead
