1. Commencement

1.01 Call to Order/Determine Quorum (7:09 p.m.)

The September 13, 2022 rescheduled regular meeting of the Sussex County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chair Seward.

3. Recognitions/Awards/Presentation

3.01 Sussex County Industrial Park Property Analysis – Jim Bruce, BFLC

Jim Bruce of Bruce Facility Planning Consultants (BFPC) in Atlanta presented virtually his findings and recommendations from his completed review of industrial properties/sites in Sussex County. Staff proposes that these recommendations be used to develop a more focused, strategic approach to marketing industrial sites in Sussex County.

There was discussion of the VEDP grant to make site shovel ready and onsite water problems.

An executive summary was provided to Board for your review. Copies of the bid sheet and project map.

No action was requested at the time.

4. Public Hearing

6. Action Items

6.01 Wildcat Swamp (Wakefield) Ditch Maintenance Project, Phase I Bid Award

County Administrator Douglas stated this project addresses significant drainage concerns in Wakefield affecting the Virginia Diner, James River Equipment, and other business, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Wooten Company several months ago to begin Phase 1 of a ditch maintenance project. Upon permit approval from the US Army Corps of Engineers (which took much longer than anticipated), the Wooten Company recently bid this project and received a low bid of \$84,274.90 from Rickmond General Contracting of Wakefield (attached for your review) to complete Phase 1 extending from Railroad Avenue to the Norfolk Southern trestle/former WWTP (this bid price was close to the engineering estimate). Based on the recommendation from the Wooten Company, staff recommends that Phase 1 be awarded to Rickmond General Contracting. In addition, resolutions are attached that appropriate reserve funds for the bid amount (\$84,274.90), as well for associated engineering and construction management costs (\$26,100).

Staff recommended bid award to Rickmond General Contracting for Phase 1 of the Wildcat Swamp Ditch Maintenance Project for \$84,274.90; approval of the attached resolutions to provide the necessary funds for the project and related engineering costs, and authorization to begin wetlands delineation, permitting, and project design for Phase 2.

Copies of the bid sheet and map were included in the Board packet.

ON MOTION OF SUPERVISOR FLY, seconded by SUPERVISOR TYLER and carried: RESOLVED that the Sussex County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the award of the bid to Rickmond General Contracting for Phase 1 of the Wildcat Swamp Ditch Maintenance Project for for \$84,274.90; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board approves Resolution #22-108 for budget amendment for the Administration department be and hereby is made for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. This resolution will appropriate local reserve funds to The Wooten Company under Task Order 2 for Phase 1 for creek maintenance adjacent to Highway 460 – Wakefield, Virginia.

6.02 Voting Precinct Ordinance

County Administrator stated that at its August 18, 2022 regular meeting, the Board voted unanimously to approve the voting precinct ordinance and map after learning that the voting

precinct boundaries must be forwarded to the Virginia Department of Elections in time for early voting and the 2022 election cycle. Given time constraints, the Board adopted that ordinance on an emergency basis, without advertising public notice, which means it can only remain in effect for 60 days. Thereafter, the County advertised the ordinance so it can remain in place permanently (or until amended by a future Board action). There are no substantive changes from the ordinance adopted on August 18.

Staff recommends the Board adopts permanent Precinct Boundaries Ordinance, precinct description and map.

The Permanent Precinct Boundaries Ordinance, Written Precinct Description, Map, and Public Notice were included in the Board packet.

ON MOTION OF SUPERVISOR TYLER, seconded by SUPERVISOR D. Jones and carried: RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors adopts precinct description, map, and permanent Ordinance to establish precinct boundaries for Election Districts 3, 6, and 7 and to reaffirm Precinct Boundaries for Election Districts 1, 2, 4 and 5, to-wit:

Whereas, on April 21, 2022, the Board of Supervisors of Sussex County, Virginia adopted AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPORTIONMENT OF MEMBERS OF SUSSEX COUNTY'S BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND SCHOOL BOARD: TO ESTABLISH BOUNDARY LINES OF THE ELECTION DISTRICTS: TO NAME EACH ELECTION DISTRICT AND TO ESTABLISH PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES, which is the County's "2022 Decennial Redistricting Plan"; and

Whereas, the 2022 Decennial Redistricting Plan established the polling places for each of the seven election districts; and

Whereas, the County is required to establish by ordinance clear boundaries for each election precinct pursuant to Virginia Code § 24.2-307; and

Whereas, for election districts 1, 2, 4 and 5, there is only a single precinct in each district, which therefore has the same boundaries as the corresponding election district, as previously adopted and as shown in the 2022 Decennial Redistricting Plan; and

Whereas, the 2022 Decennial Redistricting Plan established two precincts for each of election districts 3, 6 and 7 and designated two polling places for each of these districts; and

Whereas, the 2022 Decennial Redistricting Plan did not, however, establish the precinct boundaries for the precincts in these three election districts; and

Whereas, at its regular meeting on August 18, 2022, the Board of Supervisors adopted this Ordinance on an emergency basis in order to have the voting precincts clearly established in advance of the upcoming November 2022 General Election Cycle; and

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Whereas, the Board of Supervisors must adopt the Ordinance in compliance with the public notice requirements of Virginia Code § 15.2-1427 in order for it to remain in effect beyond the initial 60-day emergency period as originally adopted; and

Whereas, the County has properly published notice of this Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Sussex County, Virginia that the precinct boundaries for the three election districts that have multiple precincts (election districts 3 – Courthouse, 6 - Blackwater and 7 - Yale) are hereby established as more particularly described and shown in **Exhibit A**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

6.03 Surry DSS Director

County Administrator Douglas stated that the Dinwiddie County Director of Social Services Interim positon ended. He is now in the Interim Director of Social Services role. He discussed the Surry Sussex DSS Director part time agreement He noted that the County is now using the services of the Surry County Director of Social Services as the Interim Director. A copy of a Surry Sussex DSS Director part-time agreement was provided. County Administrator stated that he was asking the approval of the concept. The agreement is a 90 day agreement.

He noted that the Surry has an Administrative Board Social Services Board.

County Administrator Douglas provided an update regarding the DSS Director's interview and position. He noted that there was a 10-people on the panel. He noted that Supervisor Tyler agreed to be on the panel. He stated that the County was still in the process of filling the position for a permanent slot. There was a brief discussion of this position.

9. New Business

9.01 Fire/EMS Master Equipment Lease Agreement

Public Safety Coordinator Reid Foster requested approval from the Board of Supervisors to move forward on two items, as discussed by the Sussex Fire-Rescue Association at its monthly meeting on August 31st:

- To move forward with Schedule 3 of the fire master lease equipment schedule through Bank of America, which will provide new fire apparatus for the Wakefield and Stony Creek Volunteer Fire Departments. Mr. Foster will provide a summary of Schedule 1/2 nearing completion, and discuss the next steps necessary to complete Schedule 3. Formal consideration of bid award, financial documents, etc. is anticipated for the November board meeting if approval is granted to move forward with the process.
- 2(a) To move forward with the design of a singular plan for the proposed Waverly and Stony Creek fire/EMS stations, by requesting the Wooten Company under its general services engineering contract to prepare a design proposal for presentation at the October regular board meeting. These stations will need to be designed and bid prior to considering financing options, and could be awarded for construction as a package or individually.
- 2(b) To move forward with site acquisition for the Waverly fire/EMS station, by authorizing the County Administrator to work with the County Attorney to negotiate and execute an option agreement on preferred property(s). Several properties along the US 460 corridor have been considered to best meet fire and EMS needs but will not be discussed publicly at the board meeting. Options do not bind the Board of Supervisors to acquiring property but locks in a sales price for a defined period, which will allow for site due diligence and planning.

Staff requests approval to move forward with the equipment schedule, fire/EMS station design, and property options as requested.

There was discussion for clarification that the master agreement was for fire trucks. It was discussed was that the Schedule 3 was for fire trucks to be ordered for Stony Creek and Wakefield. It was noted that the three trucks ordered would be delivered the next day, September 14th.

ON MOTION OF SUPERVISOR FLY, seconded by SUPERVISOR FUTRELL and carried: RESOLVED that the Sussex County Board of Supervisors hereby sends this item to the Finance Committee. All Board members present voted aye.

9.02 The Henry Technology Park and Commerce Center Property

County Administrator Douglas stated that Vice Chairman W. Jones requested this item. He stated that Vice Chairman Jones is suggesting the Henry Technology Park and Commerce Center Property be placed out for bids.

The Board of Supervisors approved a one-year agreement with the Cemetery Ridge Hunt Club in 2021 for use of the Henry industrial site property in Jarratt, and the hunt club now is requesting an extension to this agreement. Supervisor Wayne Jones has been contacted by interested hunt clubs who would like to be considered for a lease or purchase of the Henry property and has suggested that a bid process be completed for a possible October award. Staff recommends that either an agreement extension or new bid process be limited to a one-year period, to provide flexibility in determining the most appropriate future use of this county property.

Staff recommended a one-year extension with Cemetery Ridge Hunt Club but does not oppose a bid process to consider other users

After discussion, it was suggested that Supervisor Tyler decide whether to bid the property out or not because it was in the Henry District. Supervisor Tyler decided to place the property out for bids.

By general consensus, the Board agreed to place the Henry Technology Park and Commerce Center Property out for bids.

A map of property location and a copy of the existing agreement with Cemetery Hunt Club were included in the Board packet.

Supervisor Futrell departed at 8:53 p.m.
