Item 1. Call To Order/Determine Quorum (7:07 pm.)

The May 16, 2013 meeting of the Sussex County Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairman Tyler.

The Invocation was offered by Supervisor Warren; the Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

The Proposed Priority List For Improvements To Secondary and Unpaved Roads was presented by Sonya Hallums-Ponton, District Program Manager, Hampton Roads, Western Region, Virginia Department of Transportation. (A copy of the plan is retained in the May 16, 2013 Board packet).

Public comments were heard from Gwendolyn Briggs, 13167 Eugene's Lane, Stony Creek VA, who asked about Eugene's Lane being added into the Six Year Plan.

Staff advised that the Board adopted a resolution in November 2011 requesting that VDOT consider placing Eugene's Lane in the Six Year Plan, however there are steps that VDOT requires the County to take before anything else can be done. (Additional information is retained in the May 16, 2013 Board packet and will be discussed later on in this meeting).

Supervisor Stringfield advised that he would like for Carver Heights Lane and Johnson Avenue to be added to the Six Year Plan, both are unpaved with several houses.

Ms. Ponton stated that she would need to coordinate with VDOT's Maintenance Office. But the roads must be a route in the system. If they are not a route in their system, they cannot be automatically added to the Plan. There may be additional documentation that the County would need to provide to bring it into the system.

8. FY 2014 PSAP Grant Award 8:42:38 PM

Eddie T. Vick, Public Safety Coordinator reported that Sussex County has been awarded funding from the FY 2014 PSAP Grant Program in the amount of \$150,000.00. He requested that the Board accept the grant and appropriate the funding in the FY 2014 budget. Also, Mr. Vick advised that in a previous budget work session, he requested additional funding for the support of the E-911 equipment. This funding includes \$14,096.97 above the grant amount, spare parts in the amount of \$8,934..97 and a five year, 24/7 warranty/support/software upgrades in the amount of \$57,314.00. He stated that he requested this funding for the FY 2014 budget. The total amount "above" the awarded grant is \$80,345.63.
