Item 8a. County Administrator's Report

Item 8a1. Health Insurance Renew Options

T. Robertson Blount, Finance Director, gave an overview of a meeting staff had on March 4th with Mr. Brian Van Huff, Account Manager with Anthem Blue Cross, to discuss the renewal rates of health care premiums for FY16. In attendance was David Rowe from Bankers Insurance, a consultant for Sussex County School Board. Together they reviewed the current enrollment data, claims experience, and projected trends in medical cost. Based on these factors Sussex County's medical renewal requires an 8.4% increase over current rates.

Currently Sussex offers employee's three choices of health options through Anthem; (1) Key Advantage Expanded, (2) Key Advantage 500, and (3) a High Deductible Plan.

At this time the County has three options that it may consider in funding the health insurance provided for the eligible Sussex County positions. A breakdown of the three options is provided in Board packets. A comparison of benefits provided by the Key Advantage Expanded and Key Advantage 500 Plans is provided in Board packets as well.

Item 8a3. Requests by Board Member

1) Amendment to the BPOL Tax

Supervisor Fly would like to suggest to the Board to amend the BPOL Tax that will exempt companies that are in Sussex County that create jobs and permanent employment. Also companies, that upon completion of their projects that provide or create permanent employment, be provided an exemption as well.

Assistant County Attorney Mike Keastner has been tasked with researching and providing a recommendation as to whether an exemption from the BPOL Tax can be done on a job creation basis.

Jason Williams, District Manager from Waste Management/Atlantic Waste Disposal, Inc. was in attendance and provided an update.

Mike Thomas, Engineering Manager for Waste Management in Virginia, was in attendance also. Mr. Thomas gave a brief overview of fatty acids and procedures used by Waste Management to reduce odor.

5) Animal Control Transfer to Sheriff's Department

Millard D. Stith, Interim Deputy County Administrator, reported that both he and Mike Kaestner, Assistant County Attorney, met with Sheriff Bell. Sheriff Bell is amenable to the transfer. Mr. Kaestner is preparing a Memorandum of Understanding to memorialize the arrangement. The transfer of Animal Control to the Sheriff's Department should become effective July 1, 2015.

Staff also anticipates working with the Sheriff Department to use their truck to attach blade for snow removal.
