ITEM G. BOARD'S ACTION ON PUBLIC HEARING ITEM

ON MOTION OF SUPERVISOR BIRDSONG, seconded by SUPERVISOR CAPLE and carried: RESOLVED that the Sussex County Board of Supervisors hereby approves an Ordinance providing for exemptions from building and other land development fees for construction and reconstruction necessitated by certain storm related damage; and

WHEREAS, the Sussex County Board of Supervisors finds that:

- a. Hurricane Irene (August 2011) created a significant and catastrophic wind damage, flooding and erosion in Sussex County, resulting in widespread damage to business and family structures; and
- b. Repair or reconstruction of damaged structures will enhance public safety and otherwise further public health, safety and welfare and
- c. That an exemption from certain permit fees imposed pursuant to the Sussex County Code and/or ordinances will help facilitate the repair or reconstruction of damaged structures, which will be beneficial to both the citizens and natural environment of Sussex County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sussex County Board of Supervisors that:

- 1. Permits required for demolition and/or construction activities necessitated by damage caused by natural disasters when declared by the Governor of Virginia and the Sussex County Board of Supervisors including Hurricane Irene shall be exempt from the fees listed in the Sussex County building, land development and wetlands ordinances and regulations for the issuance of building permits, electrical permits, mechanical and plumbing permits, permits for moving of a building or structure, permits for demolition of a building or a structure, zoning clearances not requiring the advertisement and conducting of public hearings, wetlands permits not requiring the advertisement and conducting of public hearings and erosion and sediment control permits.
 - a. This exemption shall only apply to construction that does not result in an increased square footage of a structure.

- b. This exemption shall not apply to permits required for demolition and/or construction activities not necessitated by damage caused by Hurricane Irene or any future event that has been declared a State of Emergency by the Sussex County Board of Supervisors and the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- c. This exemption shall not apply to any fee imposed by the Commonwealth of Virginia or the United States government.
- 2. The applicant(s) for any such permit shall provide all information and complete all forms required by Sussex County to substantiate the timing and nature of the damage, providing the basis for the requested fee exemption.
- 3. The application, demolition and/or construction of each structure shall comply with all requirements of federal, state and local laws and regulations, including the Sussex County Code, with the exception of the payment of the County fees listed above.
- 4. This Ordinance shall be effective retroactively to August 27, 2011 and shall be applicable to all qualifying applications filed on or after that date for one hundred and twenty (120) days from the declaration of an emergency by the Sussex County Board of Supervisors provided that the event has also been declared by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 5. This Ordinance shall, upon adoption require that the County Administrator provide notice to the Sussex County Board of Supervisors that all identified conditions have been met and that from a specified date (per event), the County Administrator will begin the reimbursement process for the approved one hundred and twenty (120) days for all items listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance, as permitted and authorized by the Sussex County Board of Supervisors

A. <u>Health Department</u>: No report at this time

B. County Administrator's Report:

1. 2011 Certified Statements of Assessed Value: The County Administrator's Office is in receipt of the 2011 Certified Statements of Assessed Value for electric gas, telecommunications and water companies for Sussex County. Also included with that report of a listing of Motor Vehicle Carrier companies that were subject to the annual Rolling Stock for the 2011 Tax Year, administered by the Public Service Taxation Division of the State Corporation Commission. A complete copy of this report is on file in the County Administrator's Office.

- **2.** Correspondences from Charter Communications: The County Administrator's Office is in receipt of correspondence from Charter Communications notifying of changes to their services, products and fees.
- 3. Fiber Installation Status Report: On Wednesday October 12, 2011 Mr. Harris and Ms. Davis met with representatives from Pearson's Appraisal (IT); the Virginia Supreme Court and Verizon to identify long-standing phone and technology issues in a comprehensive manner. While the meeting was predicated on problems associated with the Magistrate's Office, there are concerns about the lack of dependability and redundancy regarding County operations. As such, I have asked that our IT provider work with Verizon and the Supreme Court to develop a comprehensive technology plan for the complex based on the Supreme Court's willingness to do some cost sharing to meet their technology needs.
- **4. Reed Road Convenience Center Status Report:** The County Administrator reported that he has spoken with Mr. Rich Nolan regarding the Reed Road Convenience Center and he stated that the grass has been cut and the final seeding is being completed. Once completed, we will inspect for final approval.

Additionally, Mr. Nolan has advised me that he will be transferring this week to the Middle Peninsula to manage the Waste Management site there. A site visit was done and most of the grass has been cut and the seeding will begin soon.

- **5. Citizen Request:** Included in the Board packet is a Public Safety Report from Mr. Vick regarding a call received by County Administration regarding SBA Loans for Hurricane Irene.
- **6. Line of Duty Act:** The County Administrator advised that currently the Sussex County Volunteer Fire Departments are not part of the County's Official Safety Program. The County Attorney has advised that this issue will be included in the Revised *Chapter 2 of the County Ordinances* however due to the Virginia Retirement System's Line of Duty Act requirements, and the need to include all local participants immediately,

Recommendation: To approve the following Resolution as reflected in the updated Sussex County Ordinance.

C. Treasurer's Report

County Treasurer, Onnie L. Woodruff, provided details of the monthly financial report. (A copy of the report is retained in the October 20, 2011 Board packet).

D. General Registrar

William Jenkins, General Registrar, reported that since the redistricting, both at the state and local levels, the County has split precincts. This caused him to purchase three (3) additional voting machines. However, this was done without cost to the County because there were funds left over from a federal fund. Currently, without inmates, the population is 9,750 citizens; 73% percent of Sussex citizens are registered to vote.

The Registrar's Office will be open Saturdays, October 29 and November 5, 2011, from 9:00 am to 5:00 p.m., for citizens who cannot make it to the polls on November 8, 2011.

Sheriff Bell advised that he reviewed his budget recently and the Board approved \$100,000.00 for the purchase/lease of vehicles.  - **A. Purchasing and Contracting.** To act as the County's chief purchasing officer in all transactions subject to the Virginia Public Procurement Act, and in conformity with that Act to:
 - Initiate and advertise requests for proposals and invitations for bids to procure services or goods required by the County for which funding has been included in the County's adopted annual budget or otherwise appropriated by the Board, and to make and give notice of sole source determinations, documented as required by the Act.
 - **2.** Provide budgeted or specially appropriated funds are available, to negotiate, award and execute contracts or purchase orders with the winning offerors or bidders, as practicable, not to exceed \$15,000.00, and to forward recommendations to the Board for the award of contracts exceeding such limits.
- **B. Payments.** To approve warrants authorizing the timely payment of invoices or bills for goods or services rendered to the County or its agencies, provided that:
 - Funds have previously been approved in the annual budget or otherwise appropriated for the purposes for which such goods or services are used.
 - 2. The responsible County officer or employee certifies that the goods or services have been received and have been used or will be used for the intended public purposes and the County is obligated to make the payment.

- **3.** A list of all such warrants and payments is provided to the Board at its next regular meeting and placed on the consent agenda for ratification.
- **C. Grants.** To submit grant applications to federal or state agencies or nonprofit grantor organizations provided that:
 - 1. The grant will support and further a policy, plan, project, service, program, goal, objective, or ordinance previously approved by the Board.
 - **2.** Adequate budgeted or appropriated funds and personnel are available for local matching requirements of the grant and/or grant support functions.
 - **3.** The Board of Supervisors reserves the right, in its sole discretion to accept or reject any approved and offered grant.
 - **4.** If an offered grant is accepted by the Board, the County Administrator is authorized to sign the required grant agreement.
 - **D. Property Management.** To act as the custodian and manager of all County property, and in connection with County projects, (i) to execute deeds of easements to utility companies for the purpose of providing necessary services to such County property, (ii) to negotiate, accept and record easements granted to the County by other property owners in furtherance of such projects, and (iii) to secure appropriate insurance coverage on all County real and personal property and add newly acquired properties to such coverage as needed, provided that:
 - 1. The projects for which such easements are granted have been approved in the annual budget, or by other action of the Board.
 - 2. Used and replaced County vehicles, equipment or other personal property may be declared surplus and offered for sale to other agencies or to the public, at fixed prices or by auction, as the County Administrator deems appropriate.
- II. That the County Administrator shall provide the Board with a monthly list or summary of all actions taken in each of the above categories, which shall be placed on the consent agenda of the regular monthly meeting for ratification by the Board.
- III. That this resolution shall take effect upon its adoption and shall remain in effect until rescinded or amended by the Board.

A. Sussex County Courthouse Complex – Water Usage Graph: Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, stated that he is pleased to provide the Board a summary of water usage for the Courthouse Complex. This is being provided as a way of helping you understand both the significance of water and the future of Sussex County and the fact that we had a major water leak that was only recently found. As a result, there was an extraordinarily large use of water that may very well impact the Service Authority's permitted use.

He will continue to track this use so that we can insure to the best of our ability that we are not only being good stewards but are able to convey to the DEQ/State that Sussex County's future will be determined by the available water in our County.

- **B. Sussex County Reassessment Status Report:** Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator advised that per the request of the Board, he has provided an update on the County's Reassessment. He thanked Mrs. Ellen Boone, Commissioner of the Revenue for her efforts as well as Pearson's Appraisal (Robert Pearson) for their prompt response. Other than the County's request for a 90 day extension and the actual reassessments (which should be completed by February), a significant issue before the Board is to select citizens for the *Sussex County Board of Equalization and Review* to recommend to the Circuit Court for final approval.
- **C. Building Department Update:** As requested at the September Board meeting please be advised:
 - **1. Hurricane Irene Progress Report:** Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator advised that included in the Board's packet is a summary of the applications for permits due to damage from Hurricane Irene.
 - 2. Assistant to the Building Official: Thomas, E. Harris, County Administrator advised that we have received eight applications for the vacant Assistant to the Building Official position. As County Administrator, he thanked Ms. Somerbreze Hall for her years of dedicated service to the County and people of Sussex and to wish her the very best in her future endeavors (City of Suffolk). He also advised that he is working with Mr. Travis Luter, Building Official, to develop the interview questions and criteria for evaluating skill sets.
 - **3. Sick Leave:** Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator stated that he wishes Mrs. Erin Belt the very best as she prepares for major surgery. We will keep her and her family in our prayers and wish for a speedy return to work.

Harris III has provided a copy of the Fiscal Year 2011 Expenditure Report, which is available in the County Administrator's Office for review. (Copies are available to the Board members upon request).
- **E. Regulations for Temporary Signs:** Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator advised that pursuant to the Board of Supervisor's September 15, 2011 approval,

- a copy of the Sussex County Regulations for temporary (Political) signs is included in the board packet.
- **F. County Administrator Outstanding Issues/Contract Summary:** Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator provided the following updates:
 - 1. Commonwealth Attorney Office RFP: Pursuant to the April Board approval for the development of an RFP for the proposed Office addition for the Commonwealth Attorney Office (Dewberry Davis), he has signed the contract and i waiting to review the proposed RFP with staff.
 - 2. Townes Contract Amendment: Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, advised that he has been working with Mr. Charles Townes on this amendment and they have made adjustments based on Mr. Henry A. Thompson's (County Attorney) July 2010 letter to the Interim County Administrator and has provided a copy to the County Attorney. It is his wish to expedite this matter and complete this contract amendment so that staff can continue work on the Peebles Tract (to remain compliant with our Tobacco Commission Grant as staff prepares for the next round of grant funding). Needless-to-say this is a time sensitive matter that needs to be resolved. (A \$20,000.00 check is being held for work already completed before Mr. Harris' arrival pending a formal contract amendment).

3. Other:

- a. Dinwiddie County Administrator Kevin Massengill: Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, stated that he has met with Mr. Massengill to discuss several "regional" issues. Kevin has been very helpful and has expressed an interest in working with Sussex County on mutually beneficial regional activities.
- b. Greensville County Administrator K. David Whittington: Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, stated that he has met with Mr. K. David Whittington to discuss several items that could be of mutual benefit to Sussex County. Mr. Harris advised that following the meeting, he asked that written summary be provided (attached) so that he could look into each item and work with the Board on them.
- **c. Animal Control:** Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, advised that he is reviewing with Mr. Tony S. Johnson, Senior Animal Control Office, two animal care matters of long standing.

- d. Sussex County Waste Management: Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, reported that he has visited each of our "Convenience Centers" and is compiling a list of concerns. He has asked for a copy of the Waste Management Contract so he can review provisions but is very much concerned that none of our "eastern sites" have recycling bins, the deplorable conditions and cleanliness of the sites, the fact that we are still waiting for the Reed Road site to pass inspection, the fact that there is a second Waste Management Contract (Richmond) that staff may be able to consolidate into a local contract (or at least review the conditions and the need for each).
- **e.** County Administrator Meetings and Activities: Thomas E. Harris, County Administrator, advised that over the past four weeks, the County Administrator had the opportunity to meet with:
 - 1. Virginia's Gateway Region: Executive Director Renee Wyatt-Chapline, who is helping the County on the development of an Economic Development Strategy (and business development as needed) met and then followed up with a call to discuss the needs of Sussex County.

In conversation, Mrs. Wyatt-Chapline indicated that Mr. Bill Collins tenure on the Gateway Region Board will expire December 31, 2011 and the Board would need to appoint (or reappoint) a Business member (i.e. Mr. Collins who would like to be reappointed) and a Board of Supervisors Member.

Please note that Mr. Collins is a very active board member who has ably represented Sussex County and as previously mentioned, has expressed an interest to continue to serve (to both Mrs. Chapline and myself).

With this said, Mr. Harris suggested that the Board may wish to receive a formal request from Mrs. Chapline as well as to wait (as a courtesy) and let the new Board make these appointments.

2. Crater Planning District Commission: On Thursday October 13, 2011, Mr. Harris attended his first Crater Planning District Meeting. He stated that he is excited by the opportunities afforded by an active and progressive Planning District and is further encouraged

by working with not only the new members, but to once again be able to work with some old friends, William Johnson, Petersburg City Manager, Percy Ashcraft, Prince George County Administrator and Ed Dailey, Hopewell City Manager.

- **3.** Waverly Ruritan Club: Mr. Harris stated that he was honored to be asked to make a presentation to the Wakefield Ruritan Club on October 4th.
- **4. Senior Citizens of Eastern Sussex County:** Mr. Harris reported that on October 22, 2011, he was honored to speak at the 32nd Anniversary of the Senior Citizens of Eastern Sussex County.
- **5. Employee Priorities:** Mr. Harris advised that his working on a list of the priorities/needs of Sussex County as identified by our staff (Constitutional Offices and Social Services).
- 6. 2011 Angel Tree: Mr. Harris advised that included in the Board packet is a memo from the Sussex County Social Services Department regarding this year's Angel Tree. In this time when unemployment has remained so high, there is a great need for help and commended Ms. Tracy Wray, Ms. Tramall Greenerl and Ms. Chequila Fields, Director for sponsoring this special program in Sussex County.
